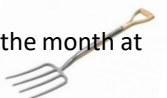
King's Thorn and Little Birch Gardening Club

Aconbury orchards help boost Hereford's organic cider

Late Autumn may be the time of 'mist and mellow fruitfulness', but it is also the time to be picking cider apples.



Mike Leigh, who lives in Aconbury, met Steve Williams and Seb Hughes, partners in Williams and Hughes, cider producers in Cradleigh when they were busy in one of Aconbury's orchards. Steve told Mike that the beauty of organic orchards is that they are never sprayed with chemicals. Mike was there to take photos when they were simply shaking the trees with their hands, hand picking the best apples off the ground and bagging them in preparation for fermentation. One 15 kilo bag will produce 7 litres of cider Steve told Mike.

Whilst there is a very wide variety of cider apples, Steve said that four are grown in Aconbury: Ashton Bitter, an Early Bittersweet, Major, another Early Bittersweet - sweet, fruity and juicy, Brown's Apple, an Early Sharp - makes a very good, slightly scented sharp cider and the final of the four varieties is the most popular – the Dabinett. Full bodied and a Full Bittersweet, an excellent single variety cider for the connoisseur.

Steve told Mike that organic cider orchards, like the ones in Aconbury, are worth preserving as they are also wildlife important areas – particularly for moths.

Many ciders, like beers have evocative names like Brown Snout, Bulls Bitter Sweet and Chisel Jersey. I've always preferred cider to beer says Mike and now that I know more about the varieties and the skill in blending I shall be looking out for these labels.

These orchards are part of Merrivale farm, the Organic Farm in Aconbury.

Make a Will, Make a Difference Will Writing Fortnight 2017

We all know we should make a Will. But how many of us put off doing so without realising the implications for those we will leave behind? Making preparations in your lifetime about what should happen to your possessions or assets after you die may save your loved ones difficulties and cost in the future. Young people, as well as those of more advanced years, can make their wishes very clear by writing a Will.

In partnership with the Royal National College for the Blind (RNC), two solicitors firms are offering to help local people get their affairs in order whilst also supporting the College's work with people who are blind and partially sighted.

From 6th to 17th March 2017, Chartered Legal Executive, Sally Smith of Harrison Clark Rickerbys Solicitors, Hereford (01432 349670) and Adrian Jones, Paralegal at Gabbs Solicitors, Leominster (01568 616333) are offering to waive their Will writing fee in exchange for a donation to RNC. This opportunity relates to basic Wills i.e. where the instructions outlined in the Will are not complex.

The suggested donation is £95 for a basic single Will and £150 for basic mirror Wills. The money raised will give students at the RNC the chance to live independently and the opportunity to prepare for university or the workplace. Demand is likely to be high so booking an appointment for Will Writing Fortnight as early as possible with one of the two participating solicitors is recommended.

LB&A NDP Steering Group

At the last meeting of the Steering Group for Little Birch & Aconbury's Joint Neighbourhood Development Plan Dr David Nicholson, our planning consultant, gave an excellent slide presentation with analysis of the recent questionnaire.

247 questionnaires had been hand delivered to all residents with 190 completed – nearly 80% of the population of both parishes. David said that the high return is exceptional – as the higher the number, the greater the representation of the community. There were five main topics – HOUSING, TRAFFIC, EMPLOYMENT, COMMUNITY SERVICES AND ENVIRONMENT.

On 'Housing' it came as no surprise that a large majority preferred to see 2/3 bedroom properties and also would like new dwellings to be privately owned. Self-build and live/work homes were also highly supported. 84% would like to see new homes within the 'village' areas with little support for large developments.

New housing should not be built in open countryside or farmland and many wanted homes for young families or young people.

Top priority on 'Traffic' was wishing improvements to road, ditch and verge. Pedestrian safety was high on priorities too. The biggest comment on 'Transport' was for traffic speed reduction on both parishes' roads and support for local buses.

When asked about 'Employment' the two largest responses were for farming and forestry related activities, many people would like to see a shop and post office.

On 'Community Services' and 'Environment' there was quite a diversity of comments - from many seeing no need to change anything, to many wishing to see improvements to Little Birch Village Hall and facilities for tourism in the area. The biggest response however was a hope to see children's play facilities. In terms of 'Environment' the greatest wish was for any new dwelling to be in keeping with its surroundings whilst also protecting views. Finally, many wished to protect local woodland, green lanes, BOATs, footpaths and the open countryside.

Of course, anyone who filled in the questionnaire will realise that the devil is in the detail. Anyone wishing more information or inspired to come along to the next Steering group meeting, then this will be on Wednesday 11 January at 7pm, at Little Birch Village Hall. All are welcome.

Now that they are meeting monthly, Little Birch Parish Council had a meeting in December, at which the planning application for the land adjacent to Prospect Cottage, 163716, was discussed. The PC decided to submit a comment to approve the application with a request for a limit on the size of lorries servicing the build to be place in the requirements.

The PC and the Village Hall Committee have purchased a defibrillator, and this will be mounted on the wall outside the village hall. We hope to have training on its use early in 2017.

Sand bags have now been placed at Castel Nibole.... But be warned, they come to the Parish empty, and the PC provide a ton of sand, so if you need sand bags, you can get them – for free - from Castle Nibole, but you will need to fill them yourselves. On the plus side, this should mean that they last longer and are less likely to split when you pick them up!

The Ward Cllr David Harlow, attended the meeting and he talked about the fact that BT were looking at removing over 180 under used phone boxes across Herefordshire. The one outside Little Birch Village Hall is on this list, and the Parish Council have asked if any one has an idea for using the box. The PC have been given the opportunity to buy the phone box, and they would then donate it to a community group who had a suitable idea for its use, and were prepared to look after it. If you do have an idea, please contact the clerk in the first instance.

The Parish Council wanted to pass on their thanks to those involved in the Neighbourhood Planning Steering Group, who they felt were doing a fantastic job in progressing through the process of drawing up the NDP. A report from their last meeting is attached separately.
