We are sad to report the death of Mrs. Connie Read, erstwhile of Llanwarne, she and husband, the late Bob Read looked after the late Percy Verry on the Barrack Hill with lunches on Fridays for many years.

We are also sad to report the untimely death of Roger Williams of Timber Lodge, Wormelow, on the A466. Roger and Jenny were enthusiastic supporters of events at Little Birch Village Hall including the annual 'Wassail', the pantomimes and annual quizzes over the past 20 years or so.

Roger was aged 70 and had suffered a fairly severe stroke some 3 weeks ago but was looked after in the Stroke Ward in the County Hospital extremely well. Sadly a second stroke took it's toll and Roger passed away at the age of 70 years.

He was a lively character and loved to play his guitar and as an accompanist to Jenny when they sang country style

The Service was conducted by the Rev. Mark Johnson who had served with Roger at the Much Dewchurch Luncheon Club since his arrival in the parishes of the Wormelow Hundred Group. and the daughters from his first marriage and step daughter, Amanda, composed a touching poem. Roger's whole life was centred around his family, even though they lived in Australia. He was in constant touch with them and although Amanda was his step- daughter, he looked after her as well.

He began life as a mechanic at Henlys and was always known as Mr. Sparky' and this nickname stuck with him for the rest of his life. And so we say farewell to a very popular and convivial character who helped so many people in all walks of life. He will be sorely missed!



Joint Neighbourhood Development Plan

The meeting of the LB&A Steering Group in July saw our Consultant Dr. David Nicholson give a presentation explaining the **Draft** Neighbourhood Development Plan.

The 'Draft' Plan is much more than just showing how to meet housing targets, but shows a vision for both Little Birch and Aconbury parishes, where both natural and historic environments are protected. Policies are included on Rural Economy, Renewable Energy, Community Facilities and protecting Local Environments. Many of these reflect the questionnaire's responses from the residents' survey.

The key word is 'Draft', as this document will be delivered shortly for Public Consultation to all households and businesses in the Neighbourhood Area of Aconbury and Little Birch for comments.

There is no long term commitment to be part of the Steering Group as anyone is welcome to attend these meetings, and, so if you wish to be part of the decision process, remember to be certain to attend the next meeting on Monday, 11 September at 7.30pm at Little Birch Village Hall.




