Little Birch & Aconbury's Joint Neighbourhood Development Plan

12 months ago Aconbury and Little Birch parishes voted to form a Joint Neighbourhood Development Plan and a Steering Group was created. Neighbourhood Development Plans give communities increased ability to influence planning decisions in their area. It gives local people new rights to shape the development of the neighbourhood in which they live.

We held three public events last summer, followed by the Questionnaire delivered to every resident. Dr. David Nicholson, our Consultant, analysed the results from the questionnaires returned and these are the basis of our Development Plan.

The next stage is to look at how new housing is to be guided, taking account of the survey results. At last month's meeting David explained his draft 'Housing Delivery Report'. The Group discussed how best to define the villages of Aconbury and Little Birch and to provide for new housing. David is now preparing a revised version of his Report in line with what was agreed – this will be looked at again by the Group at our next meeting.

We have made good progress in the past year, but we are at the stage now where decisions need to be made on the way forward. If you want to be part of that process be sure to attend. There is no long term committment to be part of the Steering Group.

The next meeting is on Wednesday 19 April at 7pm. Put this date in your diary or on your kitchen calendar. All are very welcome.



At the March Little Birch Parish Council meeting, there were apologies from Cllr Wissler and Ward Cllr Harlow.

The meeting discussed the importance of The Castle public house to the village, saying how happy they were that it had reopened and how much they hoped that those parishoners who could, would make an effort to drop in there for a drink or a meal to show support. The Parish Council have listed the pub as a 'Community Asset', as an indication to how strongly they feel that it benefits the area, and they will look to continue this listing when it comes up for renewal early next year.

The Parish Council also heard of the work that the steering group is doing on the Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP). They are keen to not only support the excellent work of this steering group, but also to encourage any parishoners who are free to attend the meetings. The steering group is at a key stage of the NDP, and the PC would remind every one that if/when it is passed, the NDP will be the guide that Herefordshire Council planning department will use in any decisions about granting planning permission up until 2031.


