#### **Local News May 17**



A belated but very warm welcome is given to Becce and Jodie Marsh who have come to live in her grandfather's (the late Terry Mock) cottage on 'Ticklywithy' pitch. We trust that they will soon settle in and make new friends.

As reported last month, Percy Verry and Ruth Cook have died. Percy was born in Hereford in 1923 and lived most of his life on the Barrack Hill, first at the top, in the parish of Aconbury, then at the bottom and from 1943 in the cottage where he spent the remainder of his life.

Sadly his mother died when he was two years old when his brother, Arthur was born. He lived with his father, Herbert, and they had a housekeeper, Mrs. Webb. Percy bought his cottage in 1943 and was then called into the Army in 1944 as a driver in the Bomb Disposal Unit.

He served in France, Belgium, Holland and Germany and finished up in Egypt. He said he didn't like the Egyptians as they pinched his lorry and he was fined £4 by the Army.

On demobilisation in 1945, he worked for Bob Reid at Lyston who had the contract for mowing the grass around the ordinance factory at Rotherwas. Bob and Connie Reid were good friends to Percy and brought round a cooked lunch on Fridays and one plated up for Saturday. After working for Bob, he worked more locally doing gardening and mowing lawns. He worked for many years for Miss Lawrence in planting vegetables and flowers.

Percy's best friend was Ivor Crum and went to the Castle Inn most nights to play Crib and have a swift half.

When Andrew Crum was born, Percy became godfather to Andrew, and he became 'one of the Crum family'. As, Samantha and Laura said in their tribute to Percy at his funeral Service at the Crematorium on Friday, 17th March.

Andrew and Gill and the family looked after Percy so well for many years and despite difficulties towards the end their care never wavered. In fact, he lived with them in their home

until they could cope no longer and Percy spent the last 6 months or so at Charnwood in Much Dewchurch , where the staff gave him excellent care. So we say farewell to another character who will be sadly missed by so many friends and acquaintances. He had a long life but was really never happy away from the Barrack Hill. We extend to Andrew and Gill and Samantha and Laura our deepest sympathies.

We are also sad to say that Ruth Cook of King's Thorn passed away on March 7<sup>th</sup> aged 90 years. Her funeral service was held at Hereford Crematorium on 21st. March and the tribute for her life was given by her niece, Bee Cullis. Ruth lived her life very quietly and had looked after her late husband, Donald, with great fortitude under difficult circumstances. She gave up driving some years ago and Derek and Mary Hill took her shopping to Belmont Tesco every Thursday. She was a very generous supporter of the Poppy Day Appeal. She will be missed by a wide circle of friends and we send to the Cullis family our sincere condolences.

Chris Savage of King's Thorn passed away on Tuesday 11th. April, just one day after his 65th birthday. He received wonderful care form his wife, Ping, and Dr. Seftel from Much Birch Surgery and the District Nurses from Belmont. Air Quality on the A49 from John Kinross

2 Phials were put up on the A49 and Tump Lane to test the air quality. They had to stay up for 14 days and then be returned to the FOE lab. for analysis. On 31st March, as follows:- Nitrogen dioxide 12.2 on A49 and 12 microgrammes per cubic metre of air, in Tump Lane.


This compares to Central Bristol which shows 40 microgrammes per cubic metre of air.

#### St. George's Day

Poor old St. George! We forgot to put him in our Diary Dates for April. St. George's Day is 23<sup>rd</sup> April but that will have come and gone by the time you all read this. St George was a Greek Christian, born in Syria, and became **Patron Saint of England** in the Tudor Period, based on his popularity during the Crusades.

However his fame today is probably due to his slaying of a dragon. And in this area we have the magnificently carved **Aconbury Dragon – Idris**. He is carved from a single fallen oak and is nearly 8m long and weighs 1.5 tons.

His 'guardians' saw in the felled tree a dragon desperately trying to emerge. Local, highly respected, wood carver Steve Elsby had the vision too – and he knew how to handle a chain saw! Idris caused quite a traffic jam on the A49 in 2004, arriving in Aconbury on a tractor drawn trailer.

There's been a long tradition of dragon legends in the Marches, such as the Dragon of Mordiford, however the name Idris comes from 'Ivor the Engine'. Such is the power of the 'guardians' children. He has a terrifying roadside presence with that fiercesome face but he is really quite friendly – doesn't mind being stroked – but asks that he not be climbed or sat on. And likes photographers too – just don't ask him to smile for the camera!

Robin treated us to a fascinating story of Brian Hatton, our Herefordshire artist, who started winning prizes at the age of 9 painting pictures which most of us would be proud to paint at our age! He displayed his love of horses and farm animals in a number of real period pieces of a way of life now gone. Some of the paintings Robin showed were of the Gower where Brian was sent to live to recuperate from various childhood afflictions. Many of the paintings Robin showed had a luminosity about them which he said the originals did not always show – the wonders of modern technology! Brian later earned his living portrait painting in London before joining the army in 1914. He was only 27 when he was killed in WW1. Robin's talk was most enjoyable and much appreciated by all present.


