Please find below tribute to Derek Hill. Donations given in memory of Derek will go to Cancer Research UK . We send our deepest sympathy to Mary and both Derek's Families.

The funeral of Derek Hill of Kings Thorn took place at Hereford Crematorium on Thursday, 31st May and was conducted by Prebendary Kay Garlick to whom we extend many thanks for using her tribute to Derek.

Address: - In that psalm, it is as the psalmist looks up to the hills that he knows that he is always in God's loving care. Many people will say they feel closest to God in the outdoors – whether on the mountains, or hills or in their own garden. Derek loved camping holidays in the mountains with the family, and of course he spent much of his time cycling around the countryside – and hills were a speciality it seems – he held the record for cycling up the steep hill at Hoarwithy from 1953 until 1989 – doing it in 1 minute 32 seconds – and even now I think only one person has broken that record and only by one second! Cycling was not just a hobby for Derek, but a major part of his life –Mary told me that not long after his by-pass operation he was back at the Velodrome at Newport. And when they took a trip out to see the bluebells in the Forest of Dean, Mary fell off and broke her wrist - and Derek took her straight to hospital - well, almost, they did have to take the precious bikes home first - you can't be too careful with a "Hetchins" bike.

Derek was born in Birmingham, and had one brother, Brian. Near the beginning of the war, in 1940, the family came to live in Ross

with his Granny Jacobs. Later they moved to Redhill, where he met Brian, and the boys remained friends from then on. Both became members of Ross cycling club as teenagers, and they and John Hall were faithful members of the club from then on. Derek's nickname in the cycling club was Ciss, because his legs went like scissors! He gained another nickname when he went into the army – because of his initials, D.R. he was always called Doctor! Derek became an electrician and worked for Norman Alder Electrics until Norman retired, when Derek became selfemployed.

Derek married Christine, and they had two children, Joanne and Jonathan. Sadly the marriage failed, but then Derek met Mary and they married in 1978, and have had 40 years together. Derek came to live with Mary in Kingsthorne and gained two stepsons, Craig and Philip. Luckily, Mary was a cyclist already – otherwise I think she would have to have taken it up! - so they have enjoyed cycling trips throughout their lives together. And they enjoyed the garden together – Derek always said that Mary was the gardener and he was the bulldozer!

Someone who knew Derek well described him to me as "the salt of the earth – so kind, would do anything for anyone", and of course he was well-known for his jokes. He loved to help people, and just a fortnight before he died, on a visit to the surgery, he noticed that there was a lot of mess outside, so he set to to sweep up. Mary of course was worried, because he really wasn't very well, so he took her home, and then came back to the surgery to finish the job!

And so today we give thanks for a full life, well lived – for the blessing of family and friends which Derek so enjoyed – for the love he received and the love he gave, and we give thanks too for the assurance that Derek rests now in the loving arms of God – in the presence of that love in which we were all created and to which we will all return.

## <u>Little Birch & Aconbury</u> <u>Joint Neighbourhood Development Plan</u> Draft Plan

Regulation 14 results are still in the process of being assimilated by our consultant Dr David Nicholson. When those results are completed, the **Joint Neighbourhood Development Draft Plan** is required to be resubmitted to Herefordshire Council for assessment. If and when given its approval the Plan will be submitted to both Little Birch Council and Aconbury Parish Meeting for their approval.

Aconbury and Little Birch Neighbourhood Development Plan 2011 -2031 then has to go through a number of checks – including an independent examination.

The final stage will be a **Referendum.** A majority of those who vote need to agree with the Plan for it to be finalised and come into use.

Set just off Welsh Newton Common, Yew Tree Cottage lies in about 5.5 acres of land.

From the medley of flower beds just outside the property there is a glorious view eastwards across southern Herefordshire as far as the Malvern Hills.

Fittingly, visitors can take in the stunning vista from this spot while enjoying the appropriately-named Malvern Hills roses draped over a pergola.

Walk through a gate onto a delightful wildflower meadow beside a three-acre paddock where you can walk your dogs. This area is also home to a beehive which has a viewing window should visitors wish to peer in.

On your return, gaze at the grapes and tomatoes grown in the green house, which also boasts a show of geraniums, including some more unusual varieties and colours.

Visitors to Yew Tree Cottage during the Open Gardens season of 2015 will notice of couple of changes this time, most notably the addition of a large wildlife pond nestled in the lawned area and sheltered by mature trees beyond the property.

There is plenty of seating in the garden, giving people the opportunity to enjoy the rambling roses, salvias and peonies, among others.

Turn off the A466 Hereford to Monmouth road at Welsh Newton, signposted to Llangarron. Turn right at the staggered crossroads then keep the phonebox on your left, before turning left into Yew Tree Cottage.





As crops and grass begin to grow, please be aware and keep all footpaths clear on your land.

For cross-field public rights of way: a minimum width of 1 metre for a footpath, and 2 metres for a bridleway. For field-edge footpaths: a minimum width of 1.5 metres, and 3 metres for a field-edge bridleway.
