

The Masons at Merrivale

Yesterday was Storm Brendan, today has been sunny with a few very light showers and then tomorrow is back to square one with wind and rain forecast.

Lots of people ask how are we coping with all this wet. Although horrible to work in, with no cattle outside at this time of year and no tractor work possible, the fields just sit there in their sodden state.

We have had sheep here again for a couple of months over the winter as their smaller feet and lighter bodies do no damage to the ground. We use them to tidy up the grass swards, eating all of the grass down so that it comes up young, fresh and full of energy in the spring.

I look back on my last article, where I hoped the rain in August would stop for a few weeks to allow for the corn harvest to be completed and enable us to fill the barns with straw for cattle bedding throughout the winter. This did happen, just, but as you will know from mid-September onwards it hasn't really stopped raining.

Arable farmers nearby have failed to drill their winter crops because of the wet conditions and it now seems increasingly likely that they won't be planted this year. The knock on effect of this is that the seed they have will sit in their barns until next year and seed for spring crops will have to be purchased instead.

Winter wheat, oats and barley all have to be sown and experience a frost so that vernalization takes place and the plant will flower and produce seed again. We thought we were doing so well to plant thirty acres of winter oats during 2 dry October days. The crop has germinated but looks very sorry for itself so some will have to be re-drilled with something else in the spring. One field has very deep ravines in it where the rain water has washed through it from a very steep field above to the ditch below. A sorry sight.

This winter is so much better than last year as regards to forage stocks. The wet summer with enough dry spells allowed us to take four good silage cuts to fill our pits. This means we won't have to buy in large amounts of hay and silage like last year, touch wood! Who knows what the seasons will bring. Ben has already decided to buy in some hay for the summer as he's convinced we will have a drought after all this rain.

The cows have been milking well through the winter as the silage we made is good quality, this is the benefit of taking more cuts when the grass is young.

Our year of no antibiotic use has gone well so far. The most common problem we treat in cows is mastitis. Where on conventional farms this would be treated with an antibiotic tube, we treat cows with a drench of garlic infused cider vinegar and a peppermint rub that is applied to the udder, not too dissimilar to deep heat. The idea of the rub is that it stimulates white blood cells in the udder which in turn fight the infection, it's surprisingly effective. If we have a particularly bad case of mastitis we can treat the cow with an anti-inflammatory injection and a large drench of diluted garlic cider vinegar which helps to flush it out of her system. We also milk the quarters out by hand to keep removing any infection. Another option we have is to stop milking, or 'dry off' a quarter which allows it to rest while the other three continue to be milked. This is very simple to do with robotic milking machines as it just involves changing a setting on the central computer.

Thank you to all of you who kindly filled in the online survey about locating a milk vending machine on the farm. Lucy is busy obtaining quotes for all of the relevant work associated with installing one and we hope to have one in place by the end of the year. We will be sure to keep you updated on any progress.

Bob and I are intending to grow some organic vegetables again this summer and hopefully open up our hut again. Our aim is to provide more local food with no miles on the clock to add to the beef that we already have available and the milk I mentioned above.

I would like to wish you all the very best for 2020. We hope for calm weather wise and also politically so we can all get on with our work with just rewards.



Big Spring Walk & Black Mountains Trek

Blow out the cobwebs this Spring by joining St Michael's Hospice as we explore our green and pleasant land.

Whether it's a gentle Sunday morning stroll, or an all-day mountain hike, we've got a walking adventure for you. The Black Mountains Trek on Saturday 7th March is a challenging 30-kilometre walk taking in the remote, dramatic scenery of this renowned mountain range. MUCH BIRCH NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

Consultation on Draft Plan

Herefordshire Local Plan Core Strategy 2011-2031, a guide to development and change in the county, sets out targets for minimum level of Housing growth required across the county and within parishes and villages. The minimum figure for Much Birch Parish is 57 and a higher target figure is recommended. At present the number of dwellings for which planning permission has been granted (but not all these sites have yet been developed) is 71.

In addition to a target figure for Housing Development the Herefordshire Council sets out in the Local Plan the broader context within which plans for future development should be considered e.g. employment, transport, climate change, education. The Much Birch Neighbourhood Development plan has been drafted with reference to this guidance.

This draft plan is based on the results of consultation with the Much Birch community through an initial survey, public consultation events and listening to the views of residents. It sets out how Much Birch Parish Council and the Community plan to meet the (Herefordshire Core Strategy) target housing development numbers within the context of positive future development for our rural Parish.

Currently the draft plan proposes:

- Some minor changes to previous Development Boundaries.
- Included within this are 3 housing sites which more than satisfy the required
- A number of other policies reflecting concerns expressed by the community including the environment, housing, transport, community facilities and supporting businesses.



History of the Hotel Name

The Hotel takes it's name from it's position on the Pilgrimage route for St Ethelbert, who was King of East Anglia from circa 779 to his untimely death in 794.

Ethelbert was lured to the Palace of King Offa, just north of Hereford, where he was promised the hand of the King's daughter, Eadburgh, in marriage.

When he arrived at Sutton Walls Palace he was treacherously captured & beheaded with his body thrown into a ditch.

He was eventually reunited with his head by a local monk and laid to rest in a tomb on the site of the ourrent Hereford Cathedral. Miracles were later reported to be connected to his shrine and he was later Canonised.

"Saint Ethelbert" is now one of two patron saints of the Cathedral, which has created the Order of St Ethelbert in his honour

Much Birch Parish Council—Winter gritting Update

Parishioners will be aware that in the event of snow responsibility for gritting the A49 (trunk road) is with Highways England who have a schedule for regular gritting.

Herefordshire Council (HC) has responsibility for gritting all other roads and have categorised the A466 and Tump Lane as priority routes as is the road through Kingsthorn being the route for a main and frequent bus service. The Thorn and Barrack Hill are on the secondary routes for gritting. Grit bins are sited throughout Much Birch Parish mainly where there are slopes, challenging road junctions and sharp bends. The majority of these bins have been supplied by HC. This year in response to additional identified need Much Birch Parish Council (MBPC) has funded several additional grit bins in locations which do not currently meet HC's criteria for the provision of one.

Bin filling.

Grit Bins that are the property of HC (marked accordingly) have been filled in readiness for the start of the winter and HC advises that if salt and resources allow they will re-stock these bins on request. The Parish Council will monitor and follow up this undertaking. Grit bins provided/sited by MBPC will be filled in readiness for winter and re-stocked as necessary.

Gritting guidance as advised by bin and salt suppliers.

When using the grit only a small amount is needed as a full shovel will be sufficient for 20-30 square metres. For maximum effect it should be spread in tyre tracks as it will then be carried further by vehicles.

Please note that the grit is only for use on public roads and pavements and not for use on private property.

The Parish Council would like to thank in advance all those who so kindly volunteer to assist others when we experience bad weather. Your generosity is appreciated.


