

Letter from Revd Mark

Hi Everyone,

Our response to the unfolding disaster that is the war in Ukraine is something to behold. We find that in the middle of a difficult time, when we are trying to get back to normal after COVID-19 and all that that brought, another crisis is unfolding in Europe. But we don't just turn off the news and ignore it! We, along with lots of other people across the UK and Europe are spurred into action. It may be the injustice of what is happening, it may be that war is once again stalking the land. Whatever it is, it has provoked something in us. Here are people just like us forced to flee for their very lives. Here are people in need, people who have lost everything.

Our response is a very human one, to support, to share, to give hope to them. In doing so, even if we don't know names or jobs or where they come from, we are sharing our common humanity.

We humans can be very tribal, we can be very exclusive – you only need to think about football fans or similar to see it in our society. Yet there are times when we push past those boundaries that we make for ourselves, when we see beyond the ends of our own noses and realise that something big is happening and we need to respond.

That common humanity, what I would call our recognition of the infinite worth of each human being made by God, is one way that we can fight back. It is the one of the things that Russia is not counting on, one of the factors it chose to ignore. And by sharing and supporting, we can show that there is another way, a better way, a peaceful way, a more human and humane way to live together.

Austin Dodd

Austin was a native of the Wirral and grew up there before entering the Merchant Navy in the early 1950s aged 17. He served two stints in the Merchant Navy and preferred the cruise liners to any other type of ship. His favourite to serve on was RMS Caronia as she plied the north Atlantic routes during the summer and the Med during the winter.

He met Doreen in Wigan in the late 1950s and they married before moving down to Chances Cottage on Upper Wrigglebrook Lane in the early 1960s with Austin's mum and dad.

After coming out of the Merchant Navy Austin worked in a bookies in Hereford, then for Coral's Betting shops where he retired on ill health after a time in hospital. He then helped out at the Axe and Cleaver for a number of years. Austin would often be seen walking his dog around the lanes and up to the iron-age fort for many years.

A few months ago, Austin's health took a turn for the worse and he ended up in hospital for a few weeks. He returned home but wasn't very mobile. He had a stroke at home in February and died peacefully in Hereford Hospital a couple of days later. He leaves a widow, Doreen.





Jobs for the garden in April Derek Scrivens

Since I sat down to write the March notes the country was ravaged by three gales in a week. Whilst sitting indoors hoping that no slates would be lost off the house roof and no glass would be blown out of the greenhouses Eunice uprooted our old Worcester Pearmain apple tree. This was an already well established tree in 1953 when Margaret moved here with her family. In addition to bearing fruit every other year and supplying seasonal Mistletoe, it had supported the washing line, been one of the goal posts for three generations of young footballers, a climbing frame, a swing hanger as well as providing shade during the day for lunches outside and the occasional BBQ. Sad, but we move on, and now a start has been made on preparing the garden for this year's fruit and vegetables. Here are a few ideas for April

- *Prune hardy fuchsias.
- *Basal cuttings of herbaceous perennials such as delphiniums and stocks can be taken this month.
- *Plant out Autumn and Winter sown sweet peas.
- *Seed can be sown direct into the border now.
- *Mulch as much of the borders as possible with manure, compost or woodchips to a depth of 5 – 10cms 2 – 4 inches in 'old money').
- *It is not too late to repot pot bound houseplants moving them on to a pot one size larger than the one they are leaving.
- *Protect fruit blossom from frost with fleece if practical.
- *Plant early seed potatoes at the beginning of the month and main crop at the end, or beginning of May. If they pop their heads up and a frost is forecast draw soil over the leaves or cover with fleece.
- *In a prepared seed bed sow, beet, carrots, leeks, parsnips, spinach, salad crops including spring onions and peas.
- *Plant onion sets and seed grown onions.
- *Sow Brussels sprouts early in the month, and also small quantities of brassicas for successional crops through the Summer.
- *Pot up tomato and pepper seedlings.
- *Sow squashes, courgettes, cucumber and sweet corn on a bright window ledge or in the greenhouse.
- *Keep listening/watching the weather forecast so that tender plants can be protected if a frost is imminent .
- *Nesting is under way so keep feeding the birds and provide fresh water.
- *Sow a small patch of wild flowers if you have a bit of space.
- *Leave a little area of lawn uncut if practical.
