Most of us alive today have known no other Monarch so the passing of Queen Elizabeth after 70 years reign feels like quite a change to some. She honoured her vow to serve, made on her twenty first birthday, and was loved and respected throughout the world not only as Queen but as a great stateswoman, meeting world leaders and visiting many countries as Head of the Commonwealth.

Her Christian faith sustained her throughout her life. She touched hearts and raised spirits wherever she went. Nearly one third of people in the UK have met her. She also had a great sense of fun, delightfully shown in her Platinum Jubilee appearance with Paddington Bear.

In her long reign there were several occasions of national celebration. Back in 1953 many who did not line the streets of London gathered together with family or neighbours to watch Queen Elizabeth's Coronation on black and white television and throughout the country communities celebrated with street parties. Little Birch held a sports day in Castle Nibole field and a fancy dress competition which was won by Iris whose mother had made her a dress from red, white and blue crepe paper.

In 1977 Little Birch celebrated the Queen's Silver Jubilee with a tea party. It was held in Little Birch hall which was refurbished for the occasion, having been closed for several years. A sports day was organized for the Golden Jubilee in 2002 in the Castle Nibole field behind Little Birch Village Hall. Events included a tug of war and a football match with men dressed as women, followed by a tea party in the village hall and a disco.

Now his majesty King Charles III has acceded to the throne and we will prepare to celebrate his coronation in due course.

Jobs for the Garden in October

Earlier this year one of my three compost bays fell apart after about fourteen years, the posts having rotted. During the latter part of August I rebuilt it. A large pile of waste material had, by now, accumulated nearby. I started to fork the waste into the new bay and to my surprise I uncovered a cluster of what I initially thought were balls of fungi. On closer inspection I realised that they were snake eggs. Having not seen a snake during our time living here I opened one egg to see what specie it was, and found it to be a Grass Snake – the young one being about 6 inches (15cms) long. I tucked the eggs and the young one into the new compost heap (I suspect the young one will die) at a similar depth to how I found them.

Jobs to do

*Alpine troughs will benefit from being placed under cover or against a wall in rain shadow away from the prevailing wind.

*Check that greenhouse heaters are in good working order (in case we have a winter!!).

*Remove saucers from under containers and pots and raise them off the ground with 'pot feet' or wooden batons.

*It is a good time to lift and divide large clumps of perennials.

*Lift and store dahlia tubers.

*Mist house plants.

*Remove larger figs which are unlikely to ripen leaving only pea sized fruit. Protect these from frost to ripen next year.

*Harvest main crop potatoes (if not already done), pumpkins and marrows.

*Keep harvesting apples, pears and grapes.

In sheltered plots sow broad beans at end of the month. They must be hardy e.g. The Sutton or Aquadulce.

* Divide rhubarb.

*Plant garlic.

*Continue to feed birds and provide fresh water. Chop up windfall apples and pears and place on bird table(s)

*Remove fruit nets. If you have a fruit cage, remove the 'roof' net just in case we have snow.

*Remove excess fallen leaves from ponds to prevent the buildup of too much decaying organic material in the water.

*Clean out and re-hang nesting boxes. **Derek Scrivens**

On 29 December 1170 Thomas Becket was brutally murdered in Canterbury Cathedral by four knights from King Henry II's entourage. It was a shocking act few could have predicted, that left medieval Europe reeling. Just over 850 years later the British Museum staged a blockbuster exhibition of his life, death, and legacy. This lecture will explore Becket's remarkable story from his birth in London around 1120, through the twists and turns of his life story, to his legacy as one of Europe's most popular saints and reflect on its resonance and relevance for modern audiences.


